Rope cattle, No. 1's fresh sold \$550. No. 2 and used sold \$425-\$435

LOOSE HORSES - unload west end of yards. (Those that are not rode or lead thru the sale ring are classified as Loose) Sold in order delivered. Friday delivered horses sell first. Will take registered paper work at check in time.

Non-Catalogue and Catalogued horses rode or led in unload at east end, by the main gate.

NEXT SALE IS JUNE 18. NOT TOO EARLY TO CONSIGN. Deadline for the catalog is June 6.

We will be featuring Weanlings & the Spelbring Quarter Horses Annual Spring Yearling Sale. Includes approximately 15 stallions & mares with strong Driftwood bloodlines.

Non-Catalogue horses that are registered, need to bring registration papers and check in ticket to Auctioneer when they bring horse into sale ring.

Out - of - State buyers require a Health & coggins test.

South Dakota Horses DO NOT require a coggins test but be aware that out of state Buyers may not bid on your horse due to lack of a Coggins test - required for them to get their health for a trip home.
